Our Programs and Services

Founded in 1890, Rescue Mission of Utica is a faith based, non-profit, multiple service, charitable organization serving Utica and the Mohawk Valley.

Open 24 hours a day, 365 days a year, The Mission "endeavors to meet the physical, emotional and spiritual needs of all people coming for assistance".

Rescue Mission provides safe lodging, food, clothing, case management, counseling, advocacy, education, referrals and support services for individuals overcoming homelessness, abuse, addictions and disabilities.

Addiction Stabilization Center—A 25 bed Residential Stabilization Service regulated by the New York State Office of Addiction and Support Services for adult men and women with Substance Use Disorder.

<u>Drop-In Center</u>—Provides services to disenfranchised individuals including: mental health, recovery, peer support, healthcare, health insurance enrollment, housing applications, job applications, and obtaining IDs. Provides free meals, clothing, and access to the food pantry.



Emergency Shelter for Men—The 59-bed Emergency Shelter provides safe lodging, meals, clothing, critically needed counseling, education, advocacy and referrals to agencies that meet the needs of the clientele. The overall goal is to help homeless people improve their quality of life, become self-sufficient and get reestablished in the community.

Community Services Programs

Dr. Alap A. Butala Food Pantry—

Offers food boxes for those in need.

One box provides 15 meals for each family member.

Community Clothing Closet—Thanks to the generosity of a caring community, we are able to provide free clothing to our residents, clients, and community members.



<u>Enriched Living Center</u>— New York State licensed, 52-single room residential program for adult men and women with mental illness. Trained staff are available on site 24 hours each day.

Our Programs and Services

Food Service—Free, nutritious meals are served daily to individuals and families in our community who are hungry, and in need of breakfast, lunch and dinner.



Parker House Aftercare Program—The Parker House Residential Aftercare Program is a six-month Christian discipleship program offering men a safe environment in which to grow spiritually while healing from addiction and other destructive behaviors. Residents receive one-onone counseling, case management, Bible study, Chapel services, outpatient treatment, and advocacy.

Representative Payee Program—

Provides bill paying and adult protective case management services to people in the community who are unable to manage their own financial affairs. Clients are primarily referred from area case management service providers, Social Services, Veterans Administration and Rescue Mission programs.

Skills for Success Program—A job training program which educates and equips students in the construction field, giving them skills for successful and meaningful employment.

<u>Spiritual Life Program</u>—Provides weekly chapel services as well as one on one spiritual counseling to clients in our programs as well as the public.



<u>Thread of Life Thrift Store</u>—Offers quality clothing, shoes, small appliances, books, household items, toys, and more at bargain prices.

West Street Apartments—42-unit complex at 1013 West Street. Provides quality, affordable housing, located on the bus line, near daycare, with access to Mission programs and services.


