

"God has a *purpose* for me."

n the mix of happy times in Stevie's childhood, there was also dysfunction and chaos. Both his parents were alcoholics, and they divorced when Stevie was just five years old. "I remember how badly it affected me," he recalls. "I was crying myself to sleep because I really missed my dad. It was hurtful."

The pain of that brokenness took root early. As Stevie grew up, depression set in, and he turned to alcohol to cope.

Addiction eventually consumed Stevie's life. His harmful choices led to jail time, costing him precious years with his children. "I never imagined not having alcohol in my life because it drowned out so much of my pain and regret. It made it worse in the end," he admits.

For a season, he maintained his sobriety – working and keeping life together – until tragedy struck. When his girlfriend miscarried, grief overwhelmed him. "That was the beginning of the end," Stevie says. He relapsed, lost his job and was evicted from his apartment.

Feeling broken and out of options, Stevie came to the Mission. Here, he was welcomed with grace and began to find hope again. He has learned to put God first and draws strength and courage from prayer.

"I've learned that as long as I put my trust in God, I can still have peace, even in the midst of the storm."



Today, Stevie has moved into his own apartment and is preparing for an internship. His dream is to become a substance abuse counselor and one day open halfway houses or an outreach center. "My whole goal is to help those struggling the same way I did."

This Christmas, Stevie is experiencing the gifts of peace and hope for a brighter future. Thank you for sharing the blessings of God's love with him! "I'm thankful to the Mission for helping me grow mentally and spiritually. Their program is life changing."


You can give them relief from the cold at Rescue Mission of Utica:
